Summary

Jesus invites all who are weary and burdened to come to Him (Matthew 11:28-30).

The world's way is laborious, vain, and ends in emptiness. It offers no lasting satisfaction.

Christ offers an exchange: our heavy burdens for His rest.

To take His yoke means to join our life to His, living in submission, discipleship, and trust.

His yoke is easy because it fits us perfectly; His burden is light because He carries it with us.

Through the Spirit, obedience becomes possible, joy replaces striving, and eternal reward is assured.

Life is choice-driven: we must choose between the world's crushing yoke or Christ's lifegiving one.
